***The Story of Frontenac Zone***

*(As written by originally written for CSPS 50<sup>th</sup>  
Anniversary Awards Banquet with some updates)*

*In the beginning there was just snow, and He saw that  
the snow needed skier, and thus ski areas were created. He*

*saw what was happening to the skiers and created patrollers, and He saw that it was good.*

*The patrollers begat more patrollers, and the ski areas begat more ski areas, and He saw that the problems of speech and “administration” were too great and thus was created the patrol. The patrol begat more patrols, and more patrols begat more problems, and thus was created the zone. Thus it came to pass that the organization was created.*

*As it so happened, the Zone begat more zones, and as is the way of men in the East, the zones seemed to radiate from the source of all good things, and the name of the centre Central. The zone to the left of this centre became Western, and as is the way of knowledge, that to the right became Eastern. No other description became necessary for was there any doubt of the centre? Those lesser beings to the left of left, were left with no name and thus wandered away.*

*The organization flourished and grew large. With the growth of the centre there seemed to be natural boundaries beyond which no patroller would go, but to the East, no such boundaries seemed to exist and growth covered much area and encompassed many strange peoples. The problems of speech and of “administration” were great but many were the men and women who wrestled with these problems, and their name shall go down in history, but will not be found here as the zone has become as the Lost Tribes and is no more.*

*It came to pass that a wise man came from west of Western, where hills are mountains, and patrollers are closer to Him. This man saw that the problem was great, and took them on as the chief of the East. A year of tribulations, agonies, and eve sacrifices to strange gods did nothing to root out the problems of speech and the distances that had to be travelled to worship. The people were unhappy, and through further election the wise man was given the right to divide. The Zone of the East became two zones to be known as Frontenac & Kawartha. The Kawartha went the way of*

*the Lost Tribes and was not heard of again, but Frontenac flourished, and grew in favour of His eyes.*

*So that all men may know these things, the boundaries of Frontenac were delineated as follows – from Lake Ontario north on Queens Highway 30 to highway 7, hence east to highway 16 and the south to the St. Lawrence River. Within these lines there have existed at various times the Alpine ski areas of Nacona on County Road 1 north of Napanee; Oak Hills on County Road 14 north of Belleville; and McCauley Mountain near Picton. Nacona was run by Hugh Finlay who successful claim to having been the first ski patroller in the eastern zone, although Jim Kelly may dispute this. Kingston Ski Hills north of Sydenham (Mount St. Sydenham) went from strength to strength to even greater height when the old rope tows were piled up to make the base for the T-Bar. These ski areas are no more, but to the everlasting glory, the area of Batawa Ski Hill north of Trenton returned to the zone in 1973, it now boasts state of the art snowmaking that, even He would be proud of and a Quad Chair lift that proudly bears the Crest of The Canadian Ski Patrol System. In 2009 Madawaska Valley (Radcliffe Hills) Ski Area, south of Barry's Bay was wrestled free from control of the fiefdom of Gatineau and brought back to the safety of Frontenac. The Nordic Patrol started at Gould Lake of the Catarauqui Conservation Area and at Skycroft on Lake Opicon Frontenac Provincial Park, Algonquin Park, and Murphy's Point Provincial Park, these patrols are no longer with us. Little Catarauqui Conservation Area grows in strength and numbers. Roving patrols can be found in, and anywhere else a race, Loppet, Speed Skating, Triathlon takes place.*

*It would be right to remember those who have taken on the mantle of chiefs of Frontenac. The first of this long and distinguished line was the former District Supervisor, East – John Vail – appointed in 1973 by the last of the Eastern chiefs, Don Coulter. This appointment was confirmed by election and this chief ruled until his accidental death in 1975. The next in line was Callum Macleod, 1975-1977,*

during his reign the house warming party of the newly built railroad-tie patrol hut at Sydenham resulted in a blaze seen from town. He was followed by Murray O'Shea who made two great things occur. He invented the pocketed first aid kit that patrollers still wear, and he ran the zone from Moose Jaw while taking flying training in the Armed Forces.

Murray O'Shea begat Debbie Bloom of fond memory, 1979-1980, who went onto greater things such as the Sweep Editor. Debbie Bloom begat Dean McCormack, 1980-1981, Dean begat Mary Woodman, 1981-1982. Mary had the distinction of rostered patrolling in the fiefdom of Gaineau whilst chief of Frontenac. Mary begat the noteworthy Ed Fletcher since he was last to leave the room in 1982. Ed's reign continued until to 1989 with the exception of the chiefdom of Gavin Hutcheson 1986-1987. Such endurance must set new records and He must smile down on Ed. Ed begat hagsafkshdghakjvgsajdvhbkajsdvfkjvjsdfksja Kingston Natioanl Annual Conference Dave begat Mike desBois 2006-2009 who made salvation to Frontenac by bringing back pennies so the zone could once again start flourishing. Mike begat Andrew Larcombe 2009 to present, when Batawa Ski Hill tried to wrest itself free from Frontenac once again. Andrew was proclaimed chief of Frontenac by the chief of the Kingdom of Ontario. Through much parlez with the chiefs of Ontario and Gatineau' secured fealty of Madawaska Valley (Radcliffe Hills) Ski Area and averted an invasion from the Lost Tribe of Kawartha who would have made East as one again.

No mention of Frontenac is complete without mentioning all the patrollers who have taken on many, many roles within the tribe of Frontenac - Ski Swaps, Swap Co-ordinators, 4 Season Events patrollers, Patrol Leaders, Assistant Patrol Leaders, Vice Presidents and Directors of all departments and finally to the patrollers, who just patrol because of the love of sliding on the snow, helping people in need of assistance, freely with their own time and energy. Many have come and gone, too numerous to name and

*number. The Canadian Ski Patrol System owes its continued existence to all of those who have strived to make Frontenac Zone what it is and will continue to be. He looks down with great kindness on us all.*
